STUDY ENGLISH LITERATURE IN ENGLAND THIS SUMMER

CHARLESTON -- Eastern Illinois University's School of Adult and Continuing Education's Office of Off-Campus and Contract Programs is offering a study abroad program in England this summer.

The program, which can be taken for credit or non-credit, will be offered from June 22 through July 18.

Participants will have the opportunity to study English authors while visiting the sites and locals associated with their works.

Field trips are planned to Stratford, Haworth, Nottingham and Whitby. There will be some weekends free for personal travel.

The trips will include visits to the Bronte Cottage in Haworth, D.H. Lawrence's home in Nottingham and the seaside cliffs of Whitby which are associated with Bram Stoker's Dracula.

Participants will stay at Harlaxton Manor, a 100-room Victorian manor house, located on the English campus of the University of Evansville. Harlaxton is located in the Midlands' market town of Grantham, 110 miles north of London.

The approximate cost of the trip is \$2,500 for those not registering for credit. Three
