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Course Description:

From bridal veils to mourning veils, from Sunday bonnets to headscarves, from the legal doctrine of coverture to the practice of Purdah, one can trace a cross-cultural and transhistorical mandate to get women under cover. In this course we will examine this cultural obsession in a variety of texts—literary and legal, verbal and visual—as we ponder the material and metaphorical significance of the figure of the veiled woman. The class will end with a consideration of women who manipulate social expectations and deliberately go "undercover."
