## Accept Seven for Service in the Army

11/13/42

Seven men were accepted for service in the United States Army, Tuesday, and were immediately sworn into the service. These were:

Don Robert Allen, Clifford Lester Kibler, Colmore Isaac Miller Jr., Bertrand Field Richards, and Ralph Charles Schackmann of Newton, Jerome Lewis Harlan of West Liberty, and Robert Felstead Fear of Willow Hill. Allen was transferred to Newton from East Chicago, Ind., where he registered.

Aden Elmer Stockwell and Arthur Carlyle Thompson of Newton, John LeRoy Rodgers of Sainte Marie, and Colonel William Tate of Bogota were rejected, and Denzil Lanter of Willow Hill was held over for further examination.

The group inducted two weeks ago left Newton, Wednesday morning for an Army camp, where they will be outfitted, given their "shots" and classified, after which they will be sent to other camps for training.
