HONORS BOWL RESULTS

CHARLESTON, IL.--Sullivan, Mount Zion, St. Elmo, Casey and Oblong high schools were the top teams in Eastern Illinois University's scholastic bowl tournament held Saturday (Feb. 2).

Sullivan placed first, Mount Zion second, St. Elmo third, and Casey fourth in the championship playoffs, while Oblong won the consolation round.

SCHOLASTIC BOWL

During the tournament, designed as a round robin competition, participants were quizzed on a variety of subjects, including math, science, history, fine arts and sports.

By winning the 16-team Honors Programs tournament at Eastern, Sullivan qualified for a national scholastic bowl tournament to be held in Houston, Texas, in June.

Those teams competing Saturday included the top teams from last week's tournament at Lake Land College, including winner and runner-up St. Elmo and Casey-Westfield.

In the championship round, Sullivan beat St. Elmo 257-175, Mount Zion 229-88 and Casey 278-75; Mt. Zion defeated Casey 138-79 and St. Elmo 122-96; and St. Elmo beat Casey 165-107.

In the consolation round, Oblong routed Taylorville 178-147, Newton 230-35 and Salem 140-80.

Individual winners included Matthew Stone, Sullivan, and David Duckwitz, St. Elmo, tied for first; Kyle Bailey, Oblong, second; Matt Rich, Robinson, third; and Matt Goben, Casey, and Joe Lindsey, Mt. Zion, tied for fourth.
