- VI. Curricular Review of the Major in Mathematics and Computer Science Report, (94-60). Dr. Broline, Dr. W. Slough, and Dr. Wohlstein presented the report and answered questions of the Council. The motion to accept the report passed unanimously.
- VII. New Course, HIS 3255, Colonial Latin America, (94-68). Dr. Maurer, Chair of History, and Dr. Warren presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The motion passed, as amended, unanimously.

This action approves the following to become effective Fall 1995: HIS 3255, Colonial Latin America. (3-0-3). On Demand. COL LATIN AMER. Survey of Latin American development from the great civilizations of the pre-columbian era to the wars of the early nineteenth century that produced independence from Spain and Portugal.

VIII. New Course, HIS 4800, The Renaissance and Reformation, (94-69). Dr. Maurer, Chair of History, and Dr. Kammerling presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The motion passed, as amended, unanimously.

This action approves the following to become effective Fall 1995, pending CGS

HIS 4800, The Renaissance and Reformation. (3-0-3). On Demand. Ren/Reform HIS. study of the intellectual and spiritual rebirth of Europe from 1350-1559. The Renaissance and Reformation movements shattered the medieval world-view, challenged its institutions and authorities, and ushered in the modern world. Prerequisite: Three hours of history or the consent of instructor.

New Course, HIS 4850, Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean, (94-70). IX. Dr. Maurer, Chair of History, and Dr. Warren presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The motion passed, as amended, unanimously.

This action approves the following to become effective Fall 1995, pending CGS approval:

HIS 4850, Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean. (3-0-3). On Demand. MEXICO AND CARIB. This course focuses on the relationships among the following issues in Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean: racial and ethnic identity; economic development; political structures, and migration. Prerequisite: Three hours of history or the

consent of the instructor. This action deletes HIS 3280.

X. New Business

Dr. C. Schmudde gave a brief presentation on the work of the General Education Assessment Committee. The Council then discussed whether or not to consider revisions to the Integrated Core.

Proposal that the CAA Only Consider Modifications in Existing Integrated Core Courses, (94-77). Dr. Bock moved and Dr. Hoberman seconded the following motion: The CAA will only consider modifications in existing Integrated Core courses. These modifications must be assessment driven. Dr. Wohlstein moved and Dr. Mason seconded the motion to suspend CAA rules and vote on the above motion. The motion to suspend the rules passed with a vote as follows:
