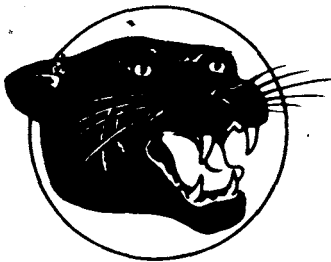

REVIEWING THE WEEKEND

MEN'S TRACK: The Panthers lost a dual meet at Louisiana Tech last Monday, 109-48, but then came back to get some outstanding performances from the weightmen and Claude Magee at the non-scoring Florida Relays.

CLAUDE MAGEE (Clermont, FL), senior sprinter, qualified for the NCAA national outdoor championship for the third time in the 100 dash . . . he won the Florida Relays in 10.17 bettering the NCAA qualifying standard of 10.33 . . . in the finals he defeated Darren Council of Auburn (10.22) and Elliott Quow of Rutgers (10.41) . . . his 10.17 time is just .01 off his school record 10.16 . . . earlier in the week Magee won the long jump in 23-10 $\frac{1}{4}$ and the 200 dash in 21.0 at Louisiana Tech.

LARRY THOENNISSEN (Morton), junior weightman, set a school record throwing the shot 57-2 to finish third in the Florida Relays . . . that throw broke Dan Matas's 1984 record of 56-5 $\frac{1}{4}$. . . Thoennissen also was third in the hammer at 167-11 and seventh in the discus at 153-0.

JIM LAIL (Dolton-Thornridge), junior weightman, placed second in the discus at the Florida Relays in 169-6 . . . Toledo's John Cole won in 175-4 . . . Lail was also fifth in the shot put at 56-9 $\frac{1}{4}$. . . that throw was better than last year's school record 56-5 $\frac{1}{4}$ by Dan Matas however in the same Florida meet teammate Larry Thoennissen threw the shot 57-2 to better both Thoennissen and Matas . . . earlier in the week at Louisiana Tech, Lail also was second in the discus at 171-3 and second in the shot in 56-4 $\frac{1}{2}$.

JIM MATON (Shelbyville), freshman middle distance runner, had an outstanding week . . . at Louisiana Tech, he won the 800 in 1:54.59 and finished second in the 1500 run . . . then he ran a personal best 800 split of 1:52.4 to help the sprint medley relay finish fifth in 3:23.69 at the Florida Relays.

BASEBALL: The Panthers finished the spring trip winning six of ten games, tying one and having seven rained out . . . EIU is 10-4-1 overall . . . the Panthers host IUPUI-Indianapolis on Tuesday (4/2) and Indiana on Wednesday (4/3), play at Purdue on Saturday (4/6) and host Purdue on Sunday (4/7) . . . individual statistics will be mailed later this week.

WOMEN'S SOFTBALL: The EIU women's softball team stretched its record to 9-3 after finishing 6-3 on its spring trip to South Carolina. Two of the losses suffered by the Lady Panthers came at the hands of nationally-rated South Carolina. Pitching was the strong suit for Eastern as the pitching staff lowered its ERA to 0.67.

ZAM MOGILL (Streator), freshman pitcher, hurled her first collegiate no-hitter as the Lady Panthers defeated NAIA power Francis Marion (SC) 6-0. Mogill's record is 4-1 with a miniscule ERA of 0.20. She has given up one earned run in 35 innings pitched this season.

SHELLY EDDINGTON (Brighton/Southwestern), senior pitcher/designated hitter, ran her record to 5-2. She also is hitting an impressive .370 with a team-leading eight RBI. Eddington also leads the club in home runs with two.

SARA KARCHER (Wayne City), freshman shortstop, leads the club in hitting with a .458 mark. Her 11 hits are second-best on the club. She had five straight hits over two games with Francis Marion. Karcher hit .550 (11-20) on the spring trip to South Carolina.

ANGEL LENDVAY (Mundelein), freshman rightfielder, is second on the club in hitting with a .429 average. She leads the team in hits with 15. Lendvay also has two doubles and a team-leading three triples to her credit. The hard-working performer went 4 for 5 with a triple and two RBI in a win against Francis Marion.

KAY MARTIN (Newton), junior leftfielder, is hitting .294 for the Lady Panthers. She is tied for fourth on the squad in hits (10) and is second in RBI (7).

TAMMI RETTIG (Bloomington), junior first baseman, is hitting .289 with 11 hits in 38 at bats. She leads the squad in runs scored with seven.

WOMEN'S TENNIS: The EIU women's tennis team improved its record to 3-2 with wins over Nicholls State (7-2) and University of New Orleans (9-0) last week. The Lady Panthers dropped an 8-1 verdict to Western Florida. "I was proud of the way we performed in Florida and Louisiana," EIU head coach Gail Richard states. "We had to juggle our lineup and the kids came through like a gem. The trip definitely prepared us for conference play and the rest of the season."
