JERILI LITTLE appeared in the first production at The Little Theatre in 1957 as Meg in **BRIGADOON**. Since that time she has played a great variety of roles including Nellie in **SOUTH PACIFIC** with Bruce Foote, Isolde in **TUNNEL OF LOVE** with Eddie Bracken, Gladys in **PAL JOEY** with Ruth Warwick and Louise in **GYPSY** with Margaret Whiting.

In addition to appearing in **CRITIC'S CHOICE** and **CARNIVAL** this season, Jerili will direct **LATE LOVE** with Margaret Truman. She directed **ROBERTA** in 1957 and **CAN-CAN** and **THE DESERT SONG** in 1958.

LILLIAN MALEK last appeared in Sullivan as Mae in **THE PAJAMA GAME**, the opening show of the 1958 season at the Grand. 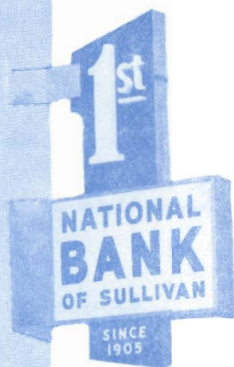

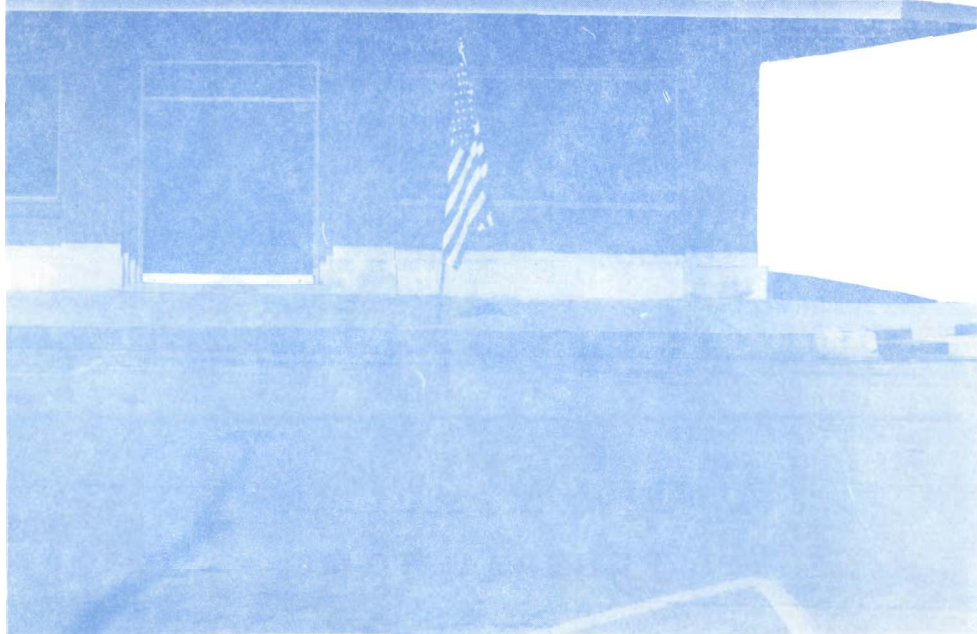

Who's Who in the Cast . . .

JOE E. BROWN (Elwood P. Dowd) and laughter are synonymous. Born in Holgate, Ohio, Joe began his career of entertaining in 1902 at the age of 10. As one of the Five Ash-tons, he did an aerial act in the Sells and Downs Circus, some 40 feet in the air over a net. The act was broken up in 1906 by the San Francisco earthquake and fire. In 1907 he broke a leg while performing with the Bell-Prevost Trio and put on his first "comic makeup."

Mr. Brown's first New York appearance came in 1920 at the Cord Theatre in **JIM JAM JAMS** followed by two years in **THE GREENWICH VILLAGE FOLLIES** and next, **BETTY LEE, CAPTAIN JINKS** and **TWINKLE TWINKLE**. In 1927 he made his first motion picture (silent) **CROOKS CAN'T WIN**. Mr. Brown made 65 films, including: **MOLLY AND ME, HIT OF THE SHOW, SALLY, FIREMAN SAVE MY**

CHILD, ALIBI IKE, ELMER THE GREAT—to name only a few.

During the war he entertained U. S. troops, setting a record of 742 overseas shows and winning a Bronze Star for his outstanding efforts—one of the few civilians accorded this honor. After the war he returned to the stage for one of his most popular roles, **HARVEY**, which ran five years, including engagements in this country, London, Sydney and Melbourne—over 1700 performances to date.

Joe E. Brown holds honorary degrees from three universities. Six baseball parks are named for him in recognition of his great interest in sports and his service to humanity. He has written two books, "Your Kids and Mine" and a biography, "Laughter Is A Wonderful Thing."

The recent disastrous Brentwood, California fire destroyed the beautiful home he shared with his wife, Mary, and wiped out a lifetime of irreplaceable mementos.

The Little Theatre is proud to present Joe E. Brown as Elwood P. Dowd in **HARVEY**, one of the American Theatre's most successful comedies.

VIOLET CARLSON (Veta Louise Simmons). The Little Theatre is delighted and honored to have Violet Carlson, one of Broadway's outstanding musical comedy stars during the 20's open the 1963 season with Joe E. Brown in

HARVEY. Miss Carlson created Gretchen in the original Broadway production of **THE STUDENT PRINCE** as well as in London. Her other N. Y. appearances include starring roles in **MY MARYLAND, EARL CARROLL'S VANITIES, LOVE CALL** and **NIGHTING GALE** among others. In Australia and New Zealand, Violet was seen in **ROSE MARIE, THE DESERT SONG, LONDON CASINO REVIEW** and **AROUND THE CLOCK**. Violet's vaudeville engagements included billing with such names as Lillian Roth, Sophie Tucker, Blossom Seeley and Walter Winchell at the Palace in New York and major vaudeville theatres across the country. She was one of the first artists to go over seas with the USO, playing for eleven months on the firing lines. During the 30's, the petite blonde spent several seasons with the St. Louis Municipal Opera and more recently, appeared as Veta at the Swan Theatre in Milwaukee with Joe E. Brown in **HARVEY**.

JOHN KELSO (Judge Gaffney) returns for his third season in Sullivan . . . this year as stage manager and director of **CRITIC'S CHOICE** and other plays. Just before returning to Sullivan, John produced, directed and appeared in a review presented at The Crystal Palace in St. Louis. John's roles with Summer of Musicals have included Ali in **OKLAHOMA!**, Mayor Shiann in **THE MUSIC MAN** and Father Grieg in **SONG OF NORWAY**. At the Crystal Palace, he has been seen in **MAJOR BARBARA, A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE** and **THE BOY FRIEND**. John also served as stage manager and aide-de-camp to such notables as Gypsy Rose Lee and Jack E. Leonard.

HERBERT O'DELL (Duane Wilson) was a scenic artist for the Vogue Terrace Dinner Theatre in Pittsburgh before returning to Sullivan for his third season. This past winter, Herbert stage managed **HAMLET** in Tampa, Florida and designed a Molier comedy. Last season he was seen as Mr. Goldstone in **GYPSY** with Margaret Whiting and during the 1961 season he played opposite Margaret Hamilton in **BLOOMER GIRL**. On the staff at the University of Miami, Herbert was lighting designer for **THE GREAT GOD BROWN** and assistant costumer for **THE VISIT**. As a performer, he has appeared in over thirty plays including **MY SISTER EILEEN** and **THE MATCHMAKER**. In addition to his duties as assistant stage manager for The Little Theatre, he will open the season as Wilson in **HARVEY**.

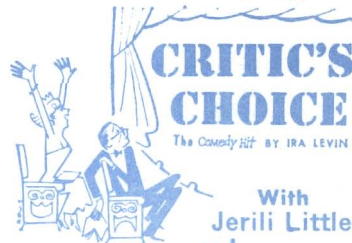
