





made famous by this master of entertainment.




April 25-27



2003 SUMMER SHOWS




June 4-15

Set in the Indian territory of the Amercian West at the turn of the century - against a background of conflict between farmers and cattleman - it is the story of Laurey and two rivals for her affections: Curly, a cowboy, and Jud, the hired farmhand. Oklahoma!, winner of a special Pulitzer Prize, opens with 'Oh, What a Beautiful Mornin' and contains a cornucopia of wonderful songs - a musical treat for the whole family.



June 18-29

Gilbert and Sullivan's hilarious comic operetta tells the story of the orphan Frederic. The son of a wealthy 19th century man. Frederic's fate takes a sudden twist when, after his father's death, his hard-of-hearing nursemaid finds him an apprentice-ship as a pirate instead of a pilot! But now at age 21 and with his indenture ending, Frederic's sense of duty calls him to rid the seas of his former friends. Despite their track record the pirates believe they have a way of keeping Frederic amongst them...



July 2-13

This celebration of the mating game takes on the truths and myths behind that contemporary conundrum known as "the relationship." Act I explores the journey from dating and waiting to love and marriage, while Act II reveals the agonies and triumphs of in-laws and newborns, trips in the family car and pick-up techniques of the geriatric set. This hilarious revue pays tribute to those who have loved and lost; to those who have fallen on their face at the portal of romance; to those who have dared to ask "Say, what are you doing Saturday Night?"



July 16-27

Set in 1928 Berlin, this dazzling multi-award winning Broadway hit chronicles the lives of several fascinating characters who pass through the hotel, weaving together their stories of yearning, greed, life and love. Their guests are keenly aware of the passage of time, and as we wait their fates, the atmosphere becomes charged with suspense!



July 30 - August 17

Rydelf High's spirited class of '59 - gumchewing, hubcap-stealing, hot-rod loving boys with D.A.'s and leather jackets and their wise-cracking girls in teased curls, bobby sox, and pedal pushers - capture the look and sound of the 1950's in a rollicking musical that salutes the rock'n'roll era. While hip Danny Zuko and wholesome Sandy Dumbrowski resolve the problems of their mutual attraction for each other, the gang dances its way through nostaglic scenes with songs, reminiscent of the rock'n'roll of the 50's such as 'Look At me, I'm Sandra Dee,' 'Summer Nights,' and 'Greased Lightnin.'




