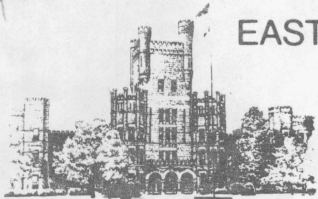

KARAMU HAS ARRIVED

CHARLESTON, IL.- With the coming of spring also comes the newest issue of Karamu, a literary magazine produced independently by the faculty of Eastern Illinois University.

The "magazine of ideas and artistic expression," featuring articles, fiction, poetry, and art work, is edited by Peggy Brayfield, professor of English.

"Anyone who enjoys fine poetry and fiction will enjoy Karamu," promises Brayfield.

Brayfield says the magazine, founded in 1966, has grown steadily, with the latest issue being more than 90 pages. Production of Karamu is financed by subscriptions and Eastern agencies including the Office of Grants and Research, the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, and the EIU Foundation.
