EIU FACULTY TO DISCUSS EFFECTS OF TECHNOLOGY ON HISTORY, DEFENSE

CHARLESTON – Eastern Illinois University's "Technology and Us" symposium will begin its Spring 2003 sessions with another double-header.

Beginning at 7 p.m. Monday, Jan. 27, Newton Key of Eastern's history department will present "Frozen in Time!" The talk will focus on how technology has affected history and history education.

Immediately following Key's presentation, Maj. David John, EIU ROTC, will present "Power for Peace," showing how technology has affected national defense.

The event will take place in the Arcola/Tuscola Room of the University Union. Admission to both talks is free and open to the public.

The talks are two in a series in commemoration of Eastern's School of Technology's Centennial Anniversary.
