Graduate students gain own voice

After years of having the Student Senate as their only voice, Eastern's graduate students now have their own organization to address their own issues. The Graduate Student Advisory Council, formed this semester by Bill Nilsen, assistant dean of the graduate school, intends to increase graduate student involvement in the issues on campus.

According to Nilsen, many issues, such as the Textbook Library, Booth Library and student parking, were not being exposed to

the graduate students' point of view.

"We are providing an organization to speak for the graduate students," Nilsen said.

At their first meeting in January, Nilsen said the group concentrated on forming an agenda and addressing graduate student issues. After deciding which issues were most important, the council settled on an approach to deal with problems, she said.

Most of the issues, such as resources at the library and rental problems at the textbook library, were dealt with by organizing individual meetings between the advi-

sory council and representatives from the library and the textbook library, Nilsen said.

Nilsen began forming the organization last semester, she said, when she contacted all the graduate program coordinators and asked each of them to select one graduate student to serve on the council.

"As the group evolves, we hope to construct some group bylaws," Nilsen said. "We would like to allow for more student say on who goes to the council."

The group, which meets monthly, intends to rethink its agenda every semester based on issues facing graduate students, she said.

1,600 Eastern grads to walk stage May 11

Eastern will graduate more than 1,600 students at its Spring Commencement ceremonies at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. May 11 on Eastern's Library Quad.

John North, professor of secondary education and foundations, will serve as faculty marshal during the morning ceremony, and Carl Emmerich, professor of art, will serve as the marshal for the afternoon ceremony.

Graduates from the College of Education, the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the School of Adult and Continuing Education will participate in the 10 a.m. ceremony.

Graduates from the Graduate School, the Lumpkin College of Business, the College of Fine Arts, the College of Applied Sciences and the College of Health, Physical Education and Recreation will participate in the 2 p.m. ceremony.

In the case of rain, the ceremonies will be held in Lantz

Gymnasium, according to Eastern's University Relations office.

Rehearsals for Commencement will be Friday, May 10. Those who are graduating in the morning need to meet at the Lantz fieldhouse at 1 p.m. while those who will graduate in the afternoon ceremony need to be at the fieldhouse at 3 p.m.

Touch-tone registration for summer intersession classes will continue May 6-11, Michael Taylor, director of registration, said.

Any student who registers for intersession after May 13 will be charged a \$25 late fee, he added.

Touch-tone registration for 5-week and 8-week courses will continue until June 4, Taylor said. Registration for these courses will resume June 10-13, he said, but the \$25 late fee will be charged.

Registration for summer workshops may be completed up until the workshop begins, he added.

Faculty and staff to 'put on the hits' at show Saturday

"Puttin' on the Ritz" will be the opening number of the performance. The show is free and open to the public.

Western Kentucky status to be known by May 15

Gateway Conference presidents and athletic directors decided Thursday that an immediate vote on the membership of Western Kentucky University wasn't necessary.

However, Eastern President Stan Rives said that the league expects to make a decision on the issue by May 15.

"We had a fairly long discussion, and there are a couple of more questions that need to be answered," Rives said after a Thursday morning tele-conference with Commissioner Patty Viverito and the six other Gateway football insti-

tutions. "But we expect to have a decision by May 15, and everybody was quite positive toward the admission of Western Kentucky."

"We all wanted to be sure that everybody had all the information they wanted," Rives added.

If an invitation is extended, the Hilltoppers, a Division I-AA independent who compete in the Sun Belt Conference in their other sports, would be competing with Eastern, Western Illinois, Northern Iowa, Illinois State, Indiana State, Southern Illinois and Southwest Missouri State in 1992.

Western Kentucky Athletic Director Jim Feix said earlier this week that his institution would accept an invitation, if offered.

Residence halls close May 9; textbook returns due May 10

As the spring semester draws to a close, so will most of Eastern.

All residence halls will close at 5 p.m. Thursday, May 9. Students who need to stay on campus for participation in graduation ceremonies must fill out a written request with their hall counselor by Friday, May 3.

According to the Housing Office, students who will graduate or participate in graduation ceremonies can stay in the halls through Saturday, May 11 and must be checked out two hours following the ceremony.

For students attending intersession and living in McKinney Hall at University Court, personal belongings can be stored in residence halls with permission of the

hall counselor through 3 p.m. Sunday, May 12.

All students residing in the residence halls received a letter from the Housing Office outlining check-out requirements and deadlines.

Any questions regarding the hall closings should be directed to the individual hall counselors.

Students can return books beginning at 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, May 4. The textbook rental service will also be open for book returns from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday May 6 through Friday May 10.

After 4:30 p.m. Friday, books will be considered late. Late fees start at \$2 and go up 25 cents each day the book is late. The highest a late fee for a book can go is \$10.
