CARL ALLEN ATTENDING RADIO SCHOOL AT CHICAGO

Chicago, April 8.—Carl Allen, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Alva Allen of Newton, is a student at the new naval training school (radio material) in Chicago. After completing his primary course in ultra high frequency radio he will be sent to an advanced Radar school. Radar is the Navy's newest secret weapon for the detection of hostile ships and aircraft.

Located in the heart of Chicago's loop, the school is directed by Lieutenant William C. Eddy, U. S. N., retired, one of the country's foremost television experts and a former submarine commander. Ensign Eugene Pulliam is the officer in charge.

One of the Navy's most vital needs today, incidentally, is the procurement of experienced radio men for Radar training. Qualified men are enlisted as petty officers, and there are opportunities for advancement. Recruiting stations will supply complete information to anyone interested in this select branch of the naval service.
