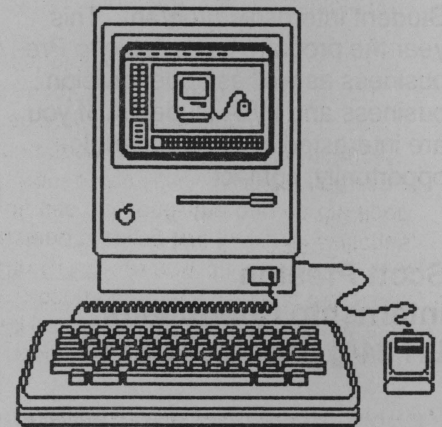
- ◆ Improved leadership skills

### Lumpkin Hall Computer Labs

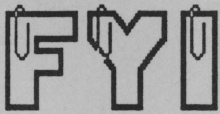

Instead of using two ON/OFF switches, you use only one--the one on the floor in front of the CPU. Another addition is the projection panel so your instructor can project information from his/her computer to the large screen at the front of the room.

LH 034--the open lab--is available for your use. On the computers in 034 you will find Lotus 1-2-3, WordPerfect 5.1, dBase III+, PC Write 2.7, and RightWriter. Other services, such as the Local Area Network (LAN), will become available later in the semester.
