CHARLESTON, IL --A partner in the Springfield accounting firm of Clifton, Gunderson and Company, Mrs. Evelyn Zuspann, will speak at Eastern Illinois University on Tuesday, Jan. 27 at 7 p.m. in the Grand Ballroom of the University Union.

Mrs. Zuspann, who is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Illinois CPA Society, will discuss "How To Succeed In Business By Really Trying."

Mrs. Zuspann passed the CPA exam in 1961, the same year she graduated from Bradley University with an accounting degree. She worked for Clifton, Gunderson and Company for three years following graduation, and then rejoined the firm when it opened a Springfield office. Mrs. Zuspann became a partner in 1978.

She works extensively in the areas of taxation, systems design and implementation, and management consulting with clients. She has also worked in the auditing areas and has assisted with computer feasibility studies.

Last May she was appointed firm-wide coordinator for accounting services.

In Springfield, Mrs. Zuspann served as Director for Aid to Retarded Children for three years and has been Chairman of the Presidents' Group for the Greater Springfield Chamber of Commerce.

She is a member of the Chamber's Board of Directors and is Vice President-Elect. Mrs. Zuspann is Chairman of the Building Committee of her church, and has served as trustee.
