State Legislators may reform kill bill

State Legislators said Thursday a compromise higher education reform bill is still possible despite a failed bid Wednesday that could have brought a Senate bill to the floor.

The failed bill called for the dissolution of the Board of Governors and Board of Regents.

The BOG and BOR are the two state governing boards overseeing a combined eight universities. Under the Senate-sponsored bill, the two boards would have been dissolved and individual local trustee boards established at the eight state universities.

It was a little disheartening. We had the votes needed, but (House Speaker) Michael Madigan (D-Chicago) had four staffers come in and help block the passage of the bill," said State Rep. Mike Weaver, R-Ashmore, referring to the fact the House Education Committee received nine votes required 10 votes needed to call the

bill to a vote in the House.

Three committee members voted present, which essentially is an abstained vote.

"We can still make amendments to the bill and use one of our backup bills that have already been sponsored," Weaver said.

State Rep. Bill Edley, D-Macomb, said that because there were no compromise efforts made by the Republican sponsors of the BOG kill bill, he was not surprised the bill was defeated. The House is controlled by the Democrats, 67-51.

"I think there needed to be governance changes, but the lieutenant governor (Bob Kustra) has plunged into this without making an effort to compromise," Edley said. "The Republicans should have realized this earlier along."

Edley said he had offered a compromise to the bill that would have created only one governing board for the eight universities instead of two and placed the university presidents on it.

"There should be more power given to the presidents," he said.

Students may use the library between 8 a.m. and 11:45 p.m. on Friday and Monday through Thursday of next week.

Regular library hours from 8 a.m. to 11:35 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 8 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. on Friday and 9 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. on Saturday will resume on Friday, May 14. Booth Library will be closed Sundays during intersession.


ELIGIBILITY FOR INTERSESSION
