Minutes - The minutes of April 28, 1992 were approved as published.

Item 92-11 - SED 2000 - Inquiry into Teaching - (1-2-1) New Course

With a well planned sequence of clinical experiences and at least 20 clock hours of observation in the schools, "Inquiry into Teaching" is designed to replace the "Learning Activities Package" (LAP). It was decided to amend 4.C (Rationale) because some departments believe they already have a course in place which is similar to or will duplicate SED 2000. 4.C (Rationale) will therefore read as follows:

"Similarity to the existing courses and/or effect upon programs in other departments: Departments with teacher certification programs currently offering an equivalent course may apply to the COECC for a substitution for this course."

Also delete 4.D and insert the following statement:

"This course, or an approved equivalent, is required of all students in a Secondary Education teacher certification program."

With the above noted revisions, the COECC unanimously approved SED 2000.

Item 92-12 - STG 3000 - Preclinical Experience w/Populations that are Culturally Diverse & Individuals w/Disabilities - (1-2-1) New Course

This course proposal will allow students to become exposed in public school settings to culturally diverse populations and also individuals with disabilities. STG 3000 is intended to replace STG 4000 - Orientation to Student Teaching - with Fall 1993 as the target date for implementation. STG 3000 was unanimously approved by the COECC.

Item 92-13 - Admission to Teacher Education Criteria & Approval to Student Teach

The revised procedure for Admission to Teacher Education and Student Teaching as proposed by the College of Education Committee to study NCATE weaknesses, was unanimously approved by the Curriculum Committee. (see attached document for specifics)
