Senate defeats exec salaries for fourth time

The Student Senate Thursday night voted down for the fourth time this semester a proposal to change student government salaries and discussed at length the November student elections.

The salary proposal fell three votes short of the 19 needed to approve a bylaw change.

However, a motion at the end of the meeting by Kyle Smith, from the Greek district, insured that the proposal will again be brought up at next Thursday's meeting.

Under the proposal, the student body president would have received a Talented Student Award (TSA) and \$20 a week salary.

Tuition and fees would have been refunded to the executive and financial vice presidents and to the speaker of the senate.

The Board of Governors representative would have received a TSA and the collective bargaining representative just tuition.

In addition, the senate pondered the possibility of using the Coles County video voting machines for the Nov. 17 student elections, at a cost of approximately \$200.

The proposal from the elections committee would also have limited the polling places to the Union only, rather than the Union and Coleman Hall, as is customarily done.

Mike Baum, elections chairperson, said he "wanted to hold the elections in the most fair place," and added the Union is the only neutral site on campus.

He said if polling booths were placed in Coleman, they should be placed in every building on campus where students have classes.

Dan Ritter, elections committee member, said the senate could not place the booths in Coleman Hall because "there are no electrical outlets where we would put them."

Grad pre-enrollment set

A special pre-enrollment request period for evening graduate students has been scheduled for Monday through Thursday, the Registration Office announced recently.

The distribution times for instruction, materials and information will be available from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on those dates in the University Union Lobby.

The pre-enrollment request period for spring semester started Oct. 4 through Nov. 5.

The Panthers were ranked seventh nationally going into Saturday's game against the fifth-rated Golden Eagles.

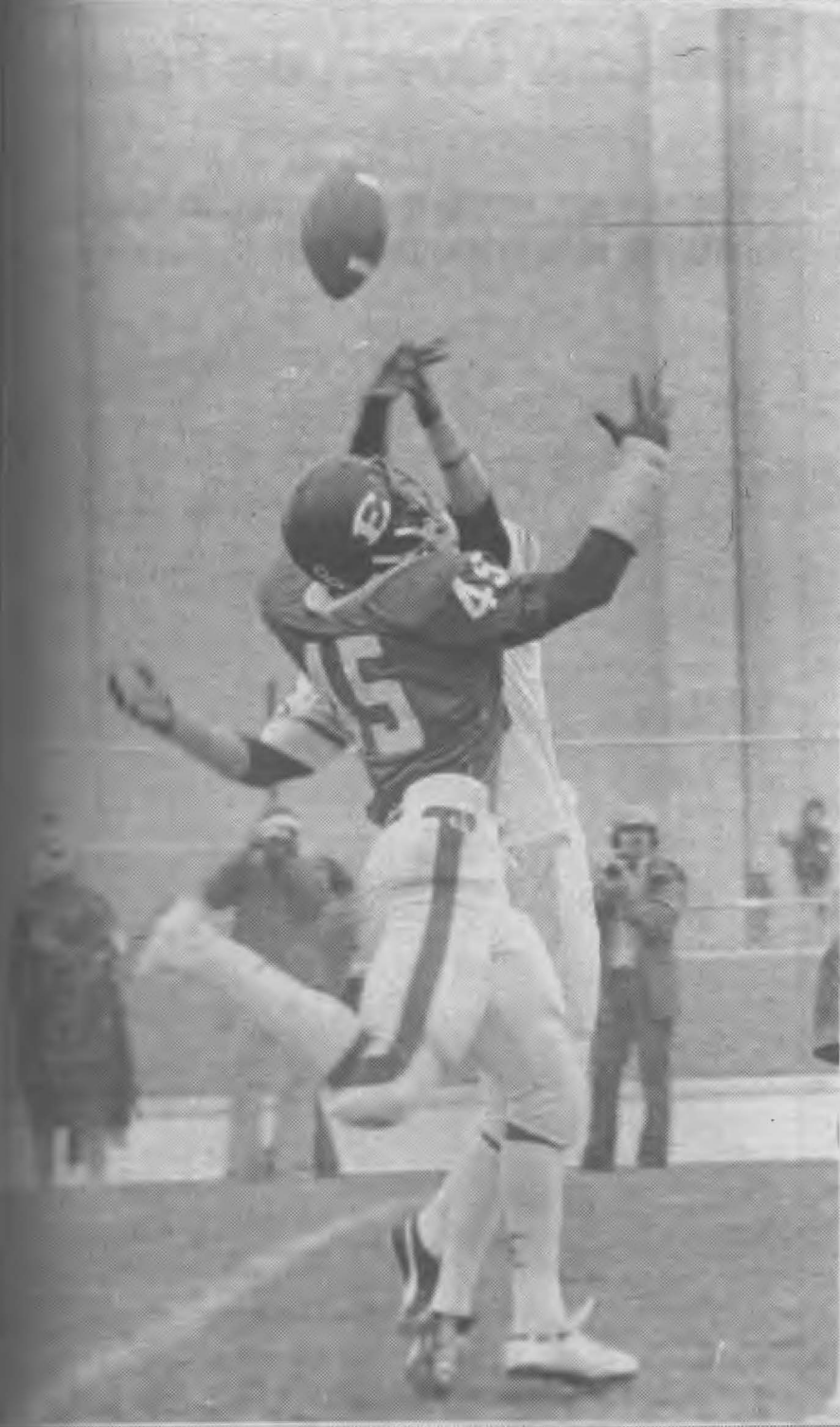
Pictured at left is defender Percell Reed in a lunge with an unidentified Tennessee Tech player for an errant pass.

Cause still not determined for student's father's crash

The cause of an airplane crash which killed the father of an Eastern student still has not been determined, the Kankakee County Sheriff's office said Sunday.

Funeral services were held recently for Donald Hendrix, 44, of Frankfort, who died from injuries sustained when his plane crashed en route home from Eastern's Parents' Weekend.

The death marks the second for Parents' Weekend this year, and the second time in two years the father of a student has died on Parents' Weekend.

The Kankakee County Coroner's office said Hendrix may have survived if the plane had been discovered earlier.

Hendricks was the father of Eastern freshman Mary Hendricks, and of Michael Hendricks, who graduated from Eastern last year.

A spokesperson from the Kankakee County Sheriff's Office said the plane was estimated to have crashed at 12:30 a.m., Saturday, but was not discovered until 4:15 p.m. Monday.

Hendricks' plane left Coles County Airport at approximately 10:30 p.m.

The spokesperson said a farmer who lived next to the field heard a loud noise Saturday morning, but was unable to see anything because of fog and high corn stalks.

AISG to hold October meeting here

The Association of Illinois Student Governments (AISG) will hold their October meeting Saturday at Eastern. Karen Anderson, vice-chairperson, said Thursday.

Anderson, who is also Eastern's representative to the AISG, said all students are welcome to attend the meeting to be held in the Union addition Tuscola-Arcola room.

The AISG's function is to "serve as a voice for students in higher education," Paul Hagen, chairperson, said.

The organization collects dues from each member school which goes to "educate legislators on student positions," Anderson said.

Recently the AISG participated in a statewide voter registration drive in which about 15,000 to 20,000 students were

registered," Hagen said.

The AISG is currently changing its tax status to enable it to become a lobbying organization, he added.

One board not enough for varied activities

By concentrating power into the proposed Student Activities Administrative Board (SAAB), the Student Senate would be ignoring a large fraction of the needs of the student body they were elected to represent.

Under the proposed plan, this "super board" would be composed of only student members appointed by the student body president, thus eliminating all student input into the choice of members on this powerful board.

It would eliminate the present system of boards and concentrate all the power into one board. This would require that the members of this board be well-informed about every student activity on campus — from the Eastern News to the Debate Club.

This plan also separates the Student Senate from the rest of the student activities. Under the SAAB proposal, the senate would be governed by the court system, which is generally a group which meets only a few times during the year.

Finally, the proposal eliminates faculty representation and vote on any governing board.

It is not hard to see the problems that could be caused by this proposal. Through presidential appointments, and lack of faculty representation, the senate has insured itself complete power over all student activities.

And, by naming an organization that rarely even meets as its governing board, the senate will basically be on its own.

There are a number of alternatives to the SAAB plan that should be considered. If the present system is to be changed and the five boards merged into one main board, the members of this committee should be elected by the students and not appointed by the president.

Another alternative to be considered is the possibility of combining the present boards into three or four boards. For instance, the Communications-Media Board and the Publications Board should be combined. This plan would allow that the members of these boards could be better informed about the activities they are expected to govern, rather than expecting board members to have much more than just a passing familiarity with every activity.

Another important consideration is faculty

representation. Faculty input into these boards is necessary because faculty members often offer a different perspective than student members.

It should also be noted that faculty members have a stake in student activities, too. Generally, professors remain at Eastern much longer than students. Therefore, they have much more experience with Eastern problems and can offer a continuing representation.

One thing is for certain: the Student Senate is certainly not considering all the ramifications of the proposed SAAB plan.

Because the senators have not considered student input into this powerful board, they have ignored the students. Because they have not considered the variety of activities to be governed by this board, they do not realize that the members could not possibly be well-informed about every decision they would be expected to make.

By initiating this plan, the senate would also do without faculty input which is necessary to the governing of activities.

And, by setting themselves apart from the student activities, the senate has made it appear that their concern is their own power and not the welfare of the students.

ACCORDING TO THE NEW FEE STRUCTURE FOR EASTERN, AS APPROVED RECENTLY BY THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS, AN OVERLOAD FEE OF \$20.00 PER SEMESTER HOUR WILL BE ASSESSED FOR EACH SEMESTER HOUR OVER SEVENTEEN (17) FOR FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS.

OVERLOAD BILLING WILL PRIMARILY AFFECT STUDENTS WITH NO SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENTS WITH ISSC AWARDS, SPECIAL EDUCATION TRAINEESHIPS, OR DIVISION OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION AWARDS. STUDENTS WITH SCHOLARSHIPS THAT NORMALLY WAIVE TUITION SHOULD CONTACT THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL AIDS TO DETERMINE WHETHER THEIR PARTICULAR SCHOLARSHIPS WILL COVER THE OVERLOAD FEE.

BOG, the AAUP, because "they are not especially held in awe by legislators."

Although Wisconsin state law prohibits collective bargaining in higher education, Wicks said with the help of labor TAUWF hopes to get a bill passed in the next session allowing them to initiate bargaining.

However, even though TAUWF had the backing of labor, they were unable to get the bill passed this year, despite "having the state president of the AFL-CIO talk to the governor."

Being affiliated with a labor organization, Wick said, would not cause TAUWF to lose their independence and ability to determine what they would want in a contract.

"We found we would have the ability to retain our local autonomy," he continued. "We would preserve and protect it with the AFT, perhaps even more than with other agencies."

He said the AFT would provide lawyers, sample contracts, research and printing services.

Kitch: AFT helps end inequalities women suffer

Collective bargaining is the "most effective weapon" women can possess against discriminatory practices, author Joanne Kitch said at a meeting of Women's Equalization (WE) Tuesday.

"Do you feel you've been discriminated against?" Kitch asked. "The union pro-

vides crucial support. The national and state AFT staff provides the unity, strength and political pressure we need."

The AFT would have provisions for salary equalization, the process of educating faculty to the importance of demands, and remedying hiring and tenure inequalities, Kitch added.

Kitch conducted a six month study funded by the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) based on data from January to June, 1974, on what collective bargaining in higher education has done for women, she said.

She also compiled a pamphlet entitled "AFT Negotiates Changes for College Women" in which she explained that AFT bargaining helped to eliminate many inequalities that women currently are suffering.

Two and a half years have lapsed since she conducted the study, she said, and what has happened since has convinced her that the only way women in colleges and universities can stop discriminatory practices in through collective bargaining.

"The federal and state governments have shown themselves unable to deal effectively with these problems," she said.

"It's important to have AFT professionals working with women from the colleges and universities in supporting our work," she continued.

She talked at length about grievance procedures, the handling of claims by faculty members that they have been treated unfairly.

Kitch said that in AFT grievance procedures, a union representative would be contacted to work with the faculty member in filing a complaint. That faculty member would then have the support of the union behind them.

Unlike the system which exists now, which most grievances come to a dead end, the AFT would prepare the case to be heard by an independent arbitrator. A decision on the case would be binding, Kitch said.

"It's not in most of our nature to be the system," Kitch said. "We need the support of the AFT to negotiate what we want and what we need through collective bargaining contracts."

Student input requested in naming of East Hall

Mike Marine, Board of Governors (BOG) student representative, said Friday, "Although no concrete plans to organize a name search have been made, I really want student input in the decision."

"I feel that our students should have a voice in the matter."

Marine said his office would be seeking students' choices, "within a week or so" and he would like the Residence Hall Association's help.

"Hall is a good name in my opinion."

The question came up with Jeff Kuhlmeier and some of his friends and, "We decided that it would probably be named after former Eastern President Fite."

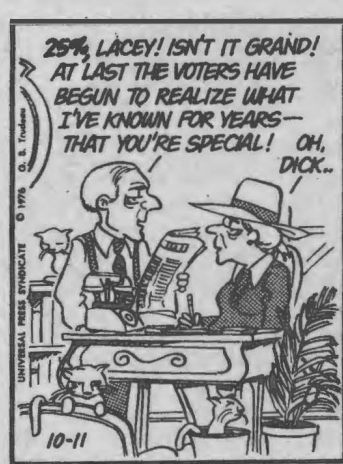
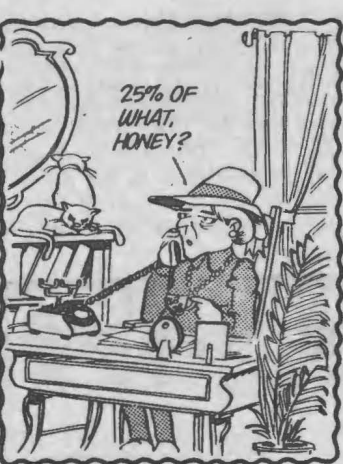
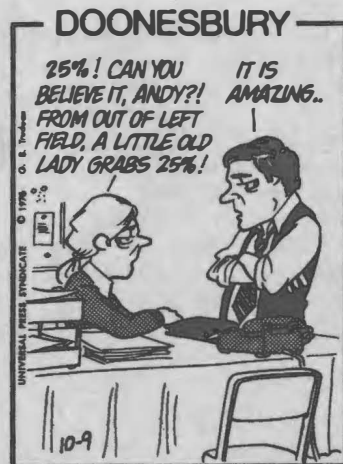

Streak ends; Tech whips Panthers

Tennessee Tech struck for 31 points in the fourth quarter to shatter Eastern's football winning streak at four Saturday, winning 41-14 at O'Brien Field.

It was Tennessee Tech's fourth straight victory after an opening loss to Furman, a Division I school. The Panthers, 7th-ranked nationally in Division II going into the contest, dropped to a 4-1 record.

Two fumbles on consecutive series led to Tennessee Tech touchdowns in the fourth quarter. Eastern led 14-10 going into the final period.

"We haven't played this bad since last year," coach John Konstantinos said. "We lost our poise, something we haven't done all year."

Tennessee Tech moved ahead 17-10 on a six-yard run by Cecil Fore, capping an 80-yard drive. The go-ahead tally came with 12:39 remaining in the game.

Tennessee Tech scored twice more within the next three minutes to put the game out of reach.

Eastern's freshman quarterback Russ Zonca fumbled at the Eastern 25 on the next series. Tennessee Tech scored in four plays, with Lamar Mike plunging for a one-yard touchdown.

A clipping penalty on the ensuing kickoff gave Eastern poor field position at its own eight. Freshman running back Chris Cobb fumbled on the first play, with Tennessee Tech's Dub Cofer recovering the ball.

Reserve quarterback Milt Jenkins rambled in from five on the next play, giving Tennessee Tech 14 points in 16 seconds, and a 31-14 advantage.

Tennessee Tech completed the fourth quarter rout with a 27-yard field goal by barefoot kicker Murray Cunningham, and a 29-yard touchdown pass from Gary Perdue to Craig Rolle.

Tennessee Tech's quarterback Jenkins, the second-string, riddled the Eastern secondary, completing all nine of his passes for 181 yards. Jenkins is a freshman.

Perdue, who started, managed five completions in 16 attempts for 112 yards.

Tennessee amassed 581 total yards — 293 passing and 288 rushing, while dominating the ball throughout the game. Eastern, which totalled 308 yards, ran only 55 plays, while Tennessee Tech had the ball for 89 tries.

The visitors dominated the offensive

statistics, with the exception of Eastern's running back Cobb. Tennessee Tech's Cecil Fore and Perdue each carried the ball for 73 yards, with Fore scoring twice.

Wide receiver Craig Rolle nabbed five passes for 139 yards. Teammate Mike Vise caught three aerials for 63 yards.

Eastern grabbed a 7-3 halftime advantage and built its lead to 14-3 in the third period on two Cobb touchdown runs. One covered 96 yards, an Eastern record.

Cobb also tallied on an 18-yard sideline scamper. He was the Panthers' only offensive threat, gaining 169 yards of the 308 total in 14 carries.

"It's hard to find anything good about this game, except for Chris," coach John Konstantinos said. "And he made some mistakes too."

Eastern lost four fumbles in the contest, including the two consecutive in the fourth quarter that broke the Panthers.

"I don't know how many turnovers we had, but it was a bunch. You can't turn over the ball against a good football team."

Turnovers hurt each team in the first half. Tennessee Tech lost two fumbles and had one pass intercepted. Safety Kim Wells made the pickoff, his sixth of the season.

The Panthers failed to capitalize, fumbling the ball away twice.

"You can boil the loss down to two

things," Konstantinos said. "First, one, plus we couldn't stop them. They whipped our butt."
