HEAR FROM MEN IN ARMED FORCES

Rev. and Mrs. C. N. Mahan of Willow Hill have received a cablegram from their son, Clay Mahan, who is in the United States Army in the Philippines, stating that he was "well yet." It was dated April 9.

Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Nichols of near Newton have a cablegram from their son Albert Nichols, sent on April 1, stating he was o. k. He has been stationed on Luzon Island and this is the first word they have received since a cable sent December 16.

Mr. and Mrs. Louis Worthey of Newton are in receipt of word from their son, Frank Worthey, in the United States Navy in the Pacific.

Mrs. George W. Davis of Newton is in receipt of word that her grandson, John Kibler Jr. of Arcola, had been promoted to a captain in the United States Army Air Force. He is stationed at Sheppard field, Wichita Falls, Texas.
