Diplomas awarded to 700 students

About 700 graduates received degrees Sunday afternoon at Lantz Gym during Eastern's 90th commencement ceremony.

Eastern President Stanley Rives gave the opening welcome, followed by the invocation, given by the Rev. Joe C. Detamore, pastor of the First Christian Church in Charleston.

In addition, a greeting was given by Robert J. Ruiz, Board of Governors member, who said, "For the graduates, this represents the end of years of hard work."

"You will be finding yourselves on the cutting edge," he said, explaining that jobs some students will enter into may be heading toward oblivion.

"It is a rare privilege to be living in these times," he said. "It will be a challenge."

Student Senate Speake Ron Wesel, who also addressed the graduating class, said, "Graduates, this will undoubtedly be one of the happiest days of your lives."

Another speaker, Patricia Cipolla, vice president of Eastern's Alumni Association, said graduation was an "achievement in which you will take much pride."

Edgar Shick, vice president of academic affairs, delivered the charge to the graduating class.

In his speech, he related stories from the Bible's book of Isaiah to the graduates future and used Florence Nightingale and Martin Luther King, Jr. as examples "of looking beyond hardships for solutions." He added, "we need diagnostic insight, like the people in Isaiah."

After the address to the class, Rives read the names of the graduates as they received their diplomas, and the singing of the Alma Mater and choral benediction and recessional followed.

Other platform guests for the commencement ceremonies included Glenn Williams, vice president for student affairs, Marion Zane, acting vice president of administration and finance and Registrar James Martin.

Students see a shortened winter break

If it seems like your winter break speeds by a little quicker this year—well you're right.

Eastern students this year will have seven fewer days to engage in all those traditional Yuletide pastimes, such as eating, drinking and sleeping.

This year's break will span from Dec. 21 to Jan. 10, exactly a week shorter than last year's break of Dec. 16 to Jan. 12.

Dean of Student Academic Services Samuel Taber said the shorter break is necessary to maintain a target number of 75 class days.

"We have the same amount of school days. They are just distributed differently," Taber said.

Because of quirks of the calendar, a three-week winter break would have meant that spring semester classes would continue right up to the start of intersession.

The only other alternative would have been to start fall semester classes a week earlier. But then, the beginning of fall semester classes would run into the end of summer session.

Taber added that Eastern students shouldn't look forward to another long winter break for at least a few years.

Although some Eastern students might be disappointed about the shorter break, not everyone at Eastern thinks it's a bad idea.

Faculty Senate member Lewis Coon, for example, believes maintaining an ideal academic semester of 75 class day should be the school's number one priority.

"Every four to six years we're going to have to slide the calendar one way or another," he said. "The important thing is to try to get adequate instruction time in between."

Senate Speaker Ron Wesel added that a few students might even prefer a shorter break. "A lot of students think it's too long because they get tired of staying home," he said.

CAA approves five senior seminar courses for spring

The Council on Academic Affairs Thursday unanimously approved five new senior seminar proposals that will be offered in Spring 1985.

The two-semester-hour courses, all numbered EIU 4022 include:

- "Computers and Society," a study of the ways computers and computer technology have penetrated society and a discussion of issues that have arisen because of various applications of the technology.

- "Communication Strategy" will examine the role that interpersonal communication plays in a world of continuous change.

- "Information Literacy" deals with how information is created, evaluated and used.

- "Science vs. Humanity" will discuss several recent developments in biology in which research has presented society with life creating, saving and altering abilities, and the questions that accompany them.

- "Civil War-Stonewell Jackson's Valley Campaign," an honors senior seminar, will give students insight into contemporary ideas regarding the Civil War and its relationship to current conflicts.

The CAA also unanimously approved several proposals that will alter

the selection of accountancy and data processing courses.

The CAA approved the deletion of Management 3800, "Introduction to Operations Management," as a requirement for accounting majors.

Accounting 4900, "Advanced Federal Tax," was changed from an elective to a required course for accounting majors.

Accounting 2200, "Individual Income Tax," was changed from a two semester hour course to a three hour course.

The CAA also approved a change in the course title, credit hours and course description of Accounting 3701 to:

"Governmental and Not-for-Profit Accounting."

The course will also be changed from an elective to a required course for accounting majors.

In other action, the CAA unanimously approved a resolution from CAA member Bob Barger.

The resolution states that giving finals the week before they are scheduled is "contrary to university regulations" unless it is a one semester hour course or the instructor has petitioned to do so.

However, giving tests during the last week of classes before finals is not against university policy.
