Mary E. Hawkins, born in England in 1877, died at Kankakee, Illinois, October 30, 1918, was at the head of Pemberton Hall from August, 1910, until March, 1917. She was a woman of education and refinement and a most efficient person in the position she occupied. Very seldom, indeed, does one find in the same individual good business ability, a most excellent housekeeper, and a fine influence over young women. Her counsel and advice were sought by those organizing work similar to hers, and her work was highly esteemed by all who knew it. Her death is sincerely mourned by all those who knew her.
