Great Lakes, Ill., Aug. 3.—Dewey Ross Connor, Jr., 21, of Newton, Ill., has been chosen honor man of his company, now in recruit training at the U. S. Naval Training Station here.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. D. R. Connor, the honor man was employed in the engineering department of Jasper County Highway Department for three years prior to his enlistment several weeks ago as an apprentice seaman. Through a series of aptitude tests given the 130 men of his company, he has been selected to attend one of the Navy's Service Schools upon graduation from training August 5.
