EIU Names Students For Caribbean Tour

Fourteen Eastern Illinois University students have been selected to make a USO-sponsored tour of military bases in the Caribbean next spring.

Eastern's Chamber Singers will be one of 30 colleges touring U. S. bases this year for the USO. Eastern is the only Illinois college selected for the 1963-64 tours.

The four week EIU tour will begin March 26 and will include the Canal Zone, Guantanamo Bay, Puerto Rico, British West Indies, and other islands.

Dr. Leo Dvorak, head of Eastern's School of Music, announced that seven women and six men will make up the touring choir. There will also be an accompanist, Suel-len Lindsay, Newton; and a director.

The latter person will be Dr. Earl Boyd, professor of music and conductor of the Eastern Illinois Symphony Orchestra.

The seven coeds chosen to make the tour are Linda Sperry, Belleville; Linda Spraggins, Casey; Tre-na Smith, Danville; Carol Masley, Divernon; Martha Van Hook, Decatur, and Marcia McKown, Palatine.

The six male voices will be supplied by Donald Peterson, Oak Lawn; John E. Hoem, Westchester; Joe Banks, Taylorville; Steve Warble, Dundee; Larry Voorhees, Hume, and Wallace Moon, Indianapolis, Ind.

The accompanist will be Suellyn Lindsey, Newton.
