CHARLESTON -- Angela Churchill, daughter of Stuart and Linda Churchill of Lincoln, received Eastern Illinois University's Richard G. Enochs Scholarship at an annual Residence Hall Association and National Residence Hall Honorary banquet.

The scholarship is awarded to a student considered to be the "best of the best" student leader who has contributed the most to his/her living environment in Eastern's residence halls.

Richard G. Enochs served as director of Married Housing from 1970 until his death in 1978. The National Residence Hall Honorary is the organization responsible for funding the living memorial.
