WORKSHOP TO FOCUS ON CIVIL RIGHTS, DIVERSITY ISSUES

CHARLESTON -- A workshop on civil rights and diversity topics will be held on Thursday, Jan. 25, at Eastern Illinois University as part of the institution's African American Heritage celebration.

Sponsored by Eastern's Affirmative Action Advisory Committee, the workshop, "Opening Doors: Diversity at Eastern," will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Thursday in the University Union.

Cynthia Nichols, director of affirmative action and cultural diversity at Eastern, said the workshop will cover diversity in the curriculum, services for students and staff with disabilities, gender equity in athletics and the recruitment and retention of minority faculty, staff and students.

"The committee believes that these are all critical topics for the university community, who will have an opportunity to share ideas and learn about these timely issues," Nichols said.
