Ken Fernandes of Newman is among those featured in "Designs of Duty," an exhibit highlighting East Central Illinois veterans and their service-related tattoos. The exhibit was curated at Booth Library on the campus of Eastern Illinois University.

The "Designs of Duty" exhibit will be on display at the Newman Regional Library from Dec. 3 through Jan. 3.

Tattoos are a common symbol among the military, and this exhibit aims to explore the inspiration and meanings behind them, as well as the stories of the veterans themselves. Pride, patriotism and honor are common themes in the artwork chosen by the veterans showcased in "Designs of Duty."

Fernandes served with the U.S. Marines in Vietnam from August 1967 through September 1968. He is one of seven military veterans featured in the exhibit who served our country over a 45-year period throughout Asia and Europe. Other veterans who are featured are from Towanda, Nokomis, Shelbyville, Olney and Charleston.
