CHARLESTON, IL--Genetic engineering technology in agriculture is the subject of the opening lecture sponsored by the American Association of University Professors at Eastern Illinois University.

Dr. Russell Carlson, Associate Professor of Chemistry, will speak on Sunday, Feb. 17 at 2 p.m. in the Booth Library Lecture Hall. Before coming to Eastern in 1979, Carlson was a senior research chemist at Monsanto Agricultural Products Co. in St. Louis.

On March 3 Dr. Edgar B. Schick will discuss "Frederick the Great and Machiavelli: the Prince as Author, the King as Ruler." Schick is Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs and is a former teacher of German language and literature.

The topic for March 17 is "How Lucy Got Around: Fossil Evidence for the Origins of Human Locomotion." The speaker will be Dr. Joanne E. Magalis, Assistant Professor of Anthropology. Her special interest is in the period one to four million years ago when the earliest known recognizable members of the human family appear in the fossil record.

The lectures are open to the public.
