FREED FROM NAZIS

April 26, '45



Sgt. Vincent Huber, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Huber of Ste. Marie, who has been held a prisoner of war in Germany, was liberated by an American tank division on Good Friday.

In a letter to his parents he says: Dear Folks: It is a lovely evening so I guess I'll sit out here and write a few lines. To begin with, don't let my return address confuse you, its just that at the present time I don't have any to give you. We have nothing to do here except eat and, boy, do they feed us. I've been eating like a 'horse and have an appetite all thei time. At first we had to get used to the rich food after eating that so called Jerry food. When ever I get home, Mom, you are going to have plenty of cooking to do, ha, ha. Well, I 'hope everyone and everything back there is O. K. I hope to be seeing you in the not too distant future. Take care of your selves. Love, Son.
