EIU PRESENTATION TO EXAMINE EGYPTIAN DRESS, PAST AND PRESENT

CHARLESTON – "What is in a Dress?," a one-hour media presentation on Egyptian clothing, ancient and contemporary, will take place on the campus of Eastern Illinois University.

The program, scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 7, in the Kansas Room of the University Union, will be presented jointly by Wafeek Wahby, School of Technology; Jean Dilworth, School of Family and Consumer Sciences; and Allison Witt, International Programs.

Admission is free and the public is invited to attend.

The presentation also will include the itinerary of a study abroad course, "Egypt 2001," which consists of an Eastern-sponsored 13-day trip to Egypt, beginning Wednesday, May 30.

The cost stands at \$3,880 per person (double occupancy), and includes EIU tuition (3 credit hours), round-trip travel between Chicago and Cairo, three domestic flights inside Egypt, a four-night Nile cruise, four-star hotels, all breakfasts, four lunches and six dinners, all English-speaking guided tours and entrance fees.
