UNIVERSITY BOARD PRESENTS BOBBY SEALE

CHARLESTON -- Bobby Seale, co-founder and former chairman of the Black Panthers, will speak at 6 p.m. Friday, Feb. 2, in the Grand Ballroom of Eastern Illinois University's Martin Luther King Jr. University Union.

Speaking on changing times, Seale calls for a new 90's breed of social and political activism. It was the influence of Malcom X which moved Seale to dedicate himself to "turning this backward racist world around; to make some human sense."

While serving as chairman, Seale was also the Panthers' national spokesman and coordinated a number of nationwide community-based programs including Cooperative Housing, Free Breakfast for School Children and mass voter registration drives.

Today Seale is the creator/director of R.E.A.C.H.!, an organization which teaches youth how to effectively organize their community.

He has an interesting twist on how the party was organized as depicted in
