CHARLESTON, IL--Harry Read, Director of Information and Publications at Eastern Illinois University, has been honored for "dutifully, energetically and superbly" serving the EIU Foundation for 30 years.

The Foundation is a separate organization which receives and administers gifts used for scholarships and other benefits for the University. Read, a graduate of West Salem High School and formerly of the Berryville area, was a charter member of the Foundation and served as secretary for 16 years. The Foundation has assets in excess of \$2 million.

Read has been Director of Information and Publications at Eastern since 1964.

A plaque was presented to Read at a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Foundation by Mrs. Marjorie Hutton, Foundation President.

The plaque states that Read "served as a guiding influence upon the foundation and the Board of Directors from its outset as a charter member, giving the utmost of himself in the performance of his responsibilities and the Board of Directors respectfully acknowledges its debt of gratitude for Mr. Read's superior service."
