CHARLESTON, IL--Tougher requirements for college admission will be among topics discussed at Eastern Illinois University's Administrators' Round Table on Tuesday, Jan. 20 at the Mattoon Holiday Inn.

Dr. Tom Layzell, Chancellor, Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities, will address the increased preparation needed for college admission, tougher requirements, and numerous issues related to higher education's expectations of the K-12 community.

Dr. Larry Janes, of Eastern's Department of Educational Administration, is coordinator of the meeting. He said two other highly-regarded speakers will be on the program. They are Pete Johnson, Executive Director of the Illinois Council of Vocational Educators, and Tom Miller, attorney with Miller, Tracy, Brown and Wilson, Ltd., Monticello.
