Students, parents, teachers and others with questions about college or career planning and/or financial aid may phone toll-free to 1-800-645-4692 with questions pertaining to college selection, admissions, testing and ways of making college attendance affordable. The most up-to-date information regarding application deadlines, college majors and entrance requirements will be available.

This free service is provided by IACAC, a non-profit organization made up of high school and college admission counselors. The phones will be staffed on both days by experienced school counselors, college admission officers and state financial aid personnel.

Wolf is enthusiastic about this opportunity offered to students and commented that, "This Hotline gives our students an extra edge, especially in the area of financial assistance and career planning. I believe that it is very important, even for current students to realize what kind of information can be available to them through this service. I would hope that many of them take advantage of this opportunity."
