The exhibition is an annual juried graphic design competition organized and circulated by the American Center for Design; it contains actual posters, flyers, booklets and other pieces selected as the best in contemporary graphic design. "Order/Disorder: Perceptions of Reality" will be on exhibit beginning Saturday, Jan. 25, through Feb. 23 in the Tarble Arts Center. The exhibition is composed of the work of three artists who deal with the complexities of visual reality. In *Pamela Bannos: Mixed Media Photographs* the multiple layers of meaning and perception are presented through responses to and the manipulation of found objects and historical documents. The work in *Mernet Larsen: Mixed Media Paintings* deals with dualisms, multiplicities and tensions utilized by the artist to seek a deeper visual truth in representing the disorder of reality she perceives. *John Siblik: Recent Paintings/Installation* is a representation of dual nature of self.
