Karl Hamilton and Byrl Griffy Receive Wounds

8/18/44

Telegrams from the War Department Tuesday afternoon brought the word that Sergeant Karl S. Hamilton, a son of John P. Hamilton of Yale, and Private First Class Byrl I. Griffy, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Griffy of Willow Hill vicinity, were slightly wounded in France on July 28.

No details of their injuries were given, although both are known to have been in France with the United States Army.

Byrl had previously written from a hospital that he was injured but did not tell how he received the wounds nor their exact nature.

Former Wendelin Man Wounded

Corporal Cornelius T. Deimel of Olney, 25, formerly of near Wendelin, was seriously wounded in France, July 28, according to word received by his brothers and sisters. He is a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Deimel of Wendelin.
