CHARLESTON, IL --The Symphonic Winds Ensemble of Eastern Illinois University will dedicate its upcoming concert to Dr. Rhoderick Key, Chairman of the Music Department since 1974. Key has accepted a position at the University of Texas, San Antonio.

The concert, featuring two student soloists, will be presented on Sunday, Feb. 15 at 4 p.m. in the Dvorak Concert Hall under the direction of Harold L. Hillyer.

Bonnie Kingery, a junior music major from <u>Effingham</u>, will be the clarinet soloist in "Sole de Concours" by Henri Rabaud. Lori Caudle, a sophomore music major from <u>Centralia</u>, will present an alto saxophone solo in "Preludio and Movendo" by Harley Rex.

Other composers represented in the program are Jules Massenet,
C. Saint-Saens, W. Francis McBeth, Shostakovich, Johannes Hanssen,
Hector Berlioz, Leonard Bernstein, and Henry Fillmore.

"Marching Down Broadway," arranged by Warren Barker, includes "Seventy-six Trombones," "The New Ashmolean Marching Society And Students' Conservatory Band," "Before The Parade Passes Me By," and "Hey, Look Me Over."

Miss Kingery is a graduate of St. Anthony High School where she was a member of the Eastern Illinois University Honor High School Band and the Illinois All-State Band. In her senior year she was the recipient of the John Philip Sousa Award.

Miss Caudle was a member of the marching and concert bands at Centralia High School, and the South Seven Band. She was also a member of the jazz band and the pit orchestra.
