CHARLESTON, IL--The Minister of Culture and Director General of the Government Information Office, Taiwan, King-yuh Chang, will speak at Eastern Illinois University on Thursday, Feb. 14 at 7:30 p.m. in the Buzzard Building Auditorium (former Lab School).

Chang will discuss "Hong Kong, Taiwan and Reunification of China." There is no admission charge.

The address will follow an initiation banquet of Pi Sigma Alpha, political science honorary, at 5:45 p.m. at E. L. Krackers. Ticket information about the banquet may be obtained by contacting the Political Science Department, 581-2523.

Chang is a member of the Prime Minister's cabinet and is in charge of all media in Taiwan and overseas press offices. He has held the post since 1984. Prior to that he was Director of the Institute of International Relations of Taiwan.

He is a former Director of Graduate Studies of the Department of Diplomacy, National Political University, Taiwan. Chang holds the Ph.D. in international relations from Columbia University.

Eastern has an exchange program with the National Kaohsiung Teacher's College in Taiwan. President Stanley Rives visited both Taiwan and the People's Republic of China last year.

Also scheduled for Thursday is a reception honoring Eastern's international students and Chang.
