EIU SPONSORS MONTH-LONG SERIES OF BLACK HISTORY EVENTS

CHARLESTON, IL.--A black art exhibit, beauty pageant, fashion show and a series of lectures are just a few of the highlights of Black History Month on the Eastern Illinois University campus.

The EIU Black Student Union, University Board, Tarble Arts Center, Afro American Studies Program and Concerned Citizens of Charleston are sponsoring the February event. The theme of this year's event is "Class and Sass," according to Jonetta Jones, EIU Director of Afro American Studies.
