REGISTRATION DEADLINE NEARS FOR TEACHING OF MATHEMATICS CONFERENCE

CHARLESTON – Anyone wishing to reserve a seat at the 44th annual Conference on the Teaching of Mathematics has until noon on Wednesday, Feb. 28, to do so.

The event will begin with an 8 a.m. registration on Tuesday, March 6, outside the Eastern Illinois University Union's Grand Ballroom. Sessions and exhibits will be available from 9 a.m. to 12:20 p.m., with the conference luncheon to follow from 12:30 to 2 p.m.

This year's conference, "The Mathematical Mosaic: Putting the Pieces Together," will include 39 sessions for teachers of grades kindergarten through college-level. Paul Sally from the University of Chicago will present the keynote address, "To Teach Mathematics, You'd Better Know Some," during the conference's luncheon.
