CHARLESTON, IL--The Glen E. Hubele National Graduate Student Award has recently been authorized by the American Association for Counseling and Development (AACD) Foundation. Hubele served as a Professor of Educational Psychology at Eastern Illinois University for eight years before dying in a car accident in 1976.

Dr. Robert Saltmarsh, a former colleague of Hubele's and a member of the AACD, said, "the scholarship was designed to honor the memory of Glen Hubele, who was a remarkable and unique faculty member at Eastern."

The scholarship is being funded through the earnings of a \$5000 gift made by his mother, the late Mrs. Cicely D. Hubele, of Grayville, Ill.

The scholarship will be available starting in 1986 to an outstanding graduate student in the field of counseling, guidance, and human development. The award will be granted to an individual for outstanding work in the development of a thesis, dissertation, or manuscript prepared and accepted for publication in an AACD or divisional professional journal.

In addition to the national scholarship offered by the AACD, Eastern offers the Glen E. Hubele Memorial scholarship, which is available to undergraduate Eastern students in the field of educational psychology and guidance.
