CHARLESTON, IL --Three choral ensembles will participate in a choral concert Thursday, Feb. 26 at 8 p.m. in the Dvorak Concert Hall, Eastern Illinois University.

The Mixed Chorus, John N. Maharg, Director, will sing "Cantate Domino" by Hassler, "The Road Not Taken" by Randall Thompson and three spirituals, including "Amazing Grace".

Michael Haydn's setting of the "Magnificat" will open the group of pieces to be sung by the Cecilian Singers, James M. Brinkman, Director. Steven Moore, a graduate student, will conduct a contemporary composition by Rubbra "A Spring Carol Sequence", which will be accompanied by a small instrumental group. The Cecilians will close with "Gloria Tibi" from Leonard Bernstein's Mass.

"Missa brevis Sti. Joannis de Deo" by Joseph Haydn will be the featured work that is sung by the Concert Choir, directed by Robert E. Snyder. The Concert Choir will also sing three motets by Reutter, Schuetz, and Halsey Stevens. There is no admission charge for this concert.
