TWO AREA STUDENTS NAMED WARNER SCHOLARS

CHARLESTON, IL.--Walter Quinn, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Quinn, live in Charleston, and Bradley A. Campbell, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Evan Campbell, live in Mattoon, and are recipients of Eastern Illinois University's 1990 Errett and Mazie Warner Presidential Awards.

Quinn, a senior English/Philosophy major, is the recipient of the Warner Presidential Award in English, while Campbell, a senior Political Science major, received the Warner/H Ogden Brainard Presidential Award in Pre-Legal Studies.

Quinn, a 1984 graduate of Charleston High School, is also the recipient of the Eunice W. Dougherty Scholarship. His wife, Michelle Freeman-Quinn of Decatur, is a 1985 Eastern graduate.

Campbell is treasurer of Sigma Iota Lambda Pre-Law fraternity at Eastern and served as a student Supreme Court Justice during 1989-1990. He also participated on Eastern's Mock Trial Team, which competed at a national competition at Drake University in February.

Since their inception in 1977, the Warner Presidential Awards have gone to 168 outstanding Eastern juniors, seniors and graduate students in 17 different academic areas.

The late Mr. Warner, a 1925 Eastern graduate, established a permanent endowment fund in 1976 to continue the scholarships. His estate will provide more than \$750,000 in cash and farm land for the endowment fund.
