CHARLESTON, IL--The man who heads the Army's Criminal Investigation Command will discuss "Coping With Terrorism In The Military, Worldwide" during an address at Eastern Illinois University on Tuesday, March 20.

Maj. Gen. Eugene R. Cromartie will speak at 7:30 p.m. in the Buzzard Building Auditorium. There is no admission charge. Cromartie's appearance is being sponsored by the Political Science Department.

Prior to his current assignment, Cromartie was Provost Marshal, U.S. Army, Europe; and Commander, First Region, U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command. He is a former commander of the 503rd Military Police Battalion and Provost Marshal of the 82nd Airborne Division.

Cromartie holds the B.S. in Social Science degree from Florida A and M and the M.S. in Ed. degree from the University of Dayton. He has attended the Army Command and General Staff School and the National War College.

The general will be initiated as an honorary member of Pi Sigma Alpha, political science honorary, at a dinner before the public lecture. Cost per ticket is \$7.50 and reservations may be made by contacting the Political Science Office, 581-2522.

Other events on Cromartie's schedule include a reception at the home of President Stanley Rives and a reception hosted by the Army ROTC unit.
