"THE BUSINESS OF RUNNING A LANDFILL" TOPIC OF UPCOMING ROUNDTABLE

CHARLESTON -- The Student Society for Economics will host a roundtable discussion on the "The Business of Running a Landfill" at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday, April 11, in Lumpkin Hall, Room 122, on the Eastern Illinois University campus.

Panel discussants include Richard Galloway and Larry Shilling of Prairie State Waste; Phil Kowalski, senior planner/economist with Envirogen; and Mitch Shick, attorney, Shick & Tapella.

The disposal of waste is a controversial issue that transcends the boundaries of politics, economics and ecology. It is a social problem that must be viewed and dealt with from many different perspectives. Topics to be discussed include the legal and environmental regulations of waste disposal, the history of the Coles County landfill and the proposed new landfill.
