Reinventing the Art of Reading Literature," July 12-15;

Ms. Sheila Tobias, "Overcoming Math Anxiety," July 19-22;

And, James Galloway, Assistant State Superintendent of Adult, Vocational
and Technical Education, "The Future of Vocational Education," Aug. 2-5.

Dr. Charles Switzer, Director, said summer school will continue with two
experimental features: an evening college designed to meet the needs of special
