CHARLESTON -- Tom Lynd, a Chiricahua-Apache Indian, will be speaking at 8 p.m. April 11, in the Grand Ballroom at Eastern Illinois University.

As one of the co-heads of the Midwest S.O.A.R.R.I.N.G. (Save Our Ancestors, Remains and Relics Indigenous Native Group) and the "Dark Knight Relatives", Lynd will speak about the history of the national organization known as the American Indian Movement from its beginning to its present. Topics will include Wounded Knee, 1973; the reservation murders, 1975; the Leonard Peltier trial and conviction, the trail of broken treaties and the Bureau of Indian Affairs office takeover.

Lynd carries both the physical and mental scars of his lifelong struggle, dedication and commitment to the Indian people throughout the country, and his brothers and sisters of the American Indian Movement.

"You don't have to hang your head to anyone when you say you're Indian," Lynd said.
