SCHOLASTIC BOWL

Glenn Williams, EIU vice president for student affairs, will greet the contestants and discuss Eastern's intellectual opportunities prior to the first round of play, which begins at 10 a.m. in Coleman Hall Auditorium.

Afternoon rounds will begin at 1:15 p.m. and awards will be presented at 3:30 p.m. by Vice President Williams.

The tournament is designed as a round robin competition in the morning, with the 16 teams divided into four groups of four teams.

The teams with the best records will then advance to the championship and consolation playoffs (elimination rounds) that will be held in the afternoon.

Those that place first, second, third, and fourth in the championship bracket and first in the consolation bracket will receive trophies. Individual awards based upon the students' performances in the morning rounds will be given to the most valuable players.
