# MISS ANNA JANSEN WEDS CPL. OLIVER EMMERICH

On January 10th at St. Joseph's church of Island Grove, Anna Jansen became the bride of Corporal Oliver Emmerich. Preceding the Nuptial High Mass a double ring ceremony was performed by Rev. Geo. Nell. The bride was given in marriage by her father, Leo B. Jansen. She was dressed in a white lace princess gown with a flowing train and a finger tip veil topped with a cluster of orange blossoms. She wore a single strand of pearls, a gift of the groom and carried a white pearl covered prayer book adorned with white carnations and satin streamers.
