for next year provides no additional funding for elementary-secondary and higher education.

Kindrick said Illinois colleges and universities, including Eastern, are suffering from a severe case of declining funds. The state reduced revenue for education last year and Thompson's proposed "level" funding plan for fiscal year 1989 will have a major impact on the quality of education at all levels, he added.

Inadequate state funding has created continuing problems for higher education, Kindrick stressed. At Eastern and other universities, faculty are leaving for jobs in other states, classes have been cut, class sizes have been increased and there has been a serious shortage of equipment for instructional purposes.

Statistically, Illinois ranks 42nd among the 50 states in per capita spending on higher education.

The situation can only be reversed if taxpayers let their legislators know how important it is to increase state funding for education, Kindrick emphasized.
