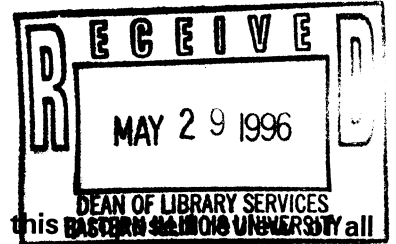
I. Minutes

The minutes of 4/22/96 were approved as published.

II. Proposals

96:16. Review of Courses Offered by the College of Sciences

Dean Wall explained to the committee the impetus behind this existing university courses. Originally it was proposed that CAA handle the review; however, since it will be such a large undertaking, CAA may suggest that the college curriculum committees handle it. Guidelines for the review are forthcoming. It was the consensus of COSCC members that the natural place for this review is at the departmental level. Dean Wall will convey this suggestion at Dean's Council.



96:15. New Course Proposal -- Zoology 2200. Human Anatomy. (3-3-4).

Dr. Miller presented the proposal and responded to questions from the committee members. Dr. Bruehler moved and Dr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the course proposal. The new course proposal passed unanimously as amended.

96:17. Approval Procedure for Proposed Honors Courses and Programs in the College of Sciences

Dean Wall requested input from the committee regarding the approval procedure for honors programs and honors courses offered by the College of Sciences. Currently these proposals are not routed through COSCC. After some discussion, the curriculum committee decided to leave the procedure as it is.

ZOO 2000 -- Delete from the course offerings pending CAA approval of ZOO 2200.

Chair Sheeran thanked the committee members for their service during the past two semesters. COSCC meetings for the summer term will be on call by the chair.
