Representatives from our college will meet with Brian Sowa to discuss concerns regarding the recent proposal to add lab hours to CMN 3950, Conference and Event Planning.

**REVISIONS TO INT MAJOR**

Dr. Lou Butler presented the proposal to change the INT Electives requirement for the INT major. Currently, students select 9 hrs. from BUS 2101, INT 2953, 3012, 3043, 4673, 4803. Instead of listing specific courses, the proposal calls for all INT courses, other than INT core, INT Senior Seminar courses, and INT General Ed courses, as choices for INT electives. Courses from outside the major or transfer courses that support technical management may be considered as INT electives, upon departmental approval. Courses will not double count for concentration and to meet INT elective hours.

C. Roszkowski (B. Ruot) moved to approve and vote on the proposal at an electronic meeting Monday, May 2. All approved.
